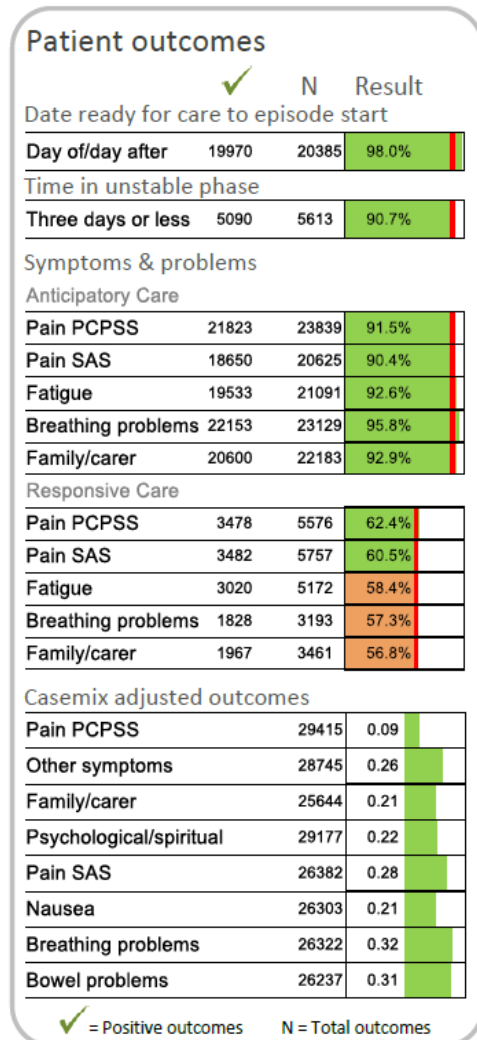

### Patient outcomes box



The patient outcomes box summarises the benchmark results for your service. There are 20 Benchmarks represented.

The numbers under the ✓ indicate the **number of positive outcomes** measured for that benchmark

The numbers under the N indicate the **total number of outcomes** measured for that benchmark.

*For example, for the time in Unstable phase there were 5090 Unstable phases recorded that were 3 days or less out of a total 5613 unstable phases recorded.*

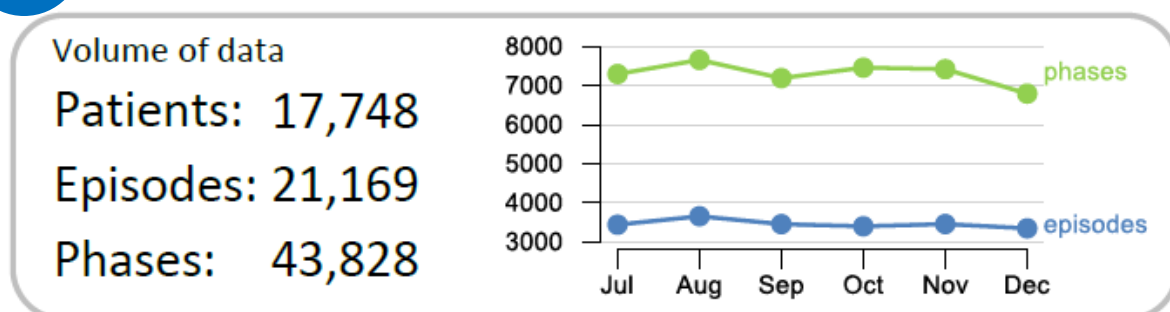
The middle rectangles (under Result-coloured **green or orange**) contain your service's benchmark results (e.g., 90.7% for time in Unstable phase). The **Red vertical line** in the box indicates the benchmark.

The amount of shading in the rectangle reflects the result achieved.

- **Green shading** means your service result is above the benchmark
- **Orange shading** means your service result is below the benchmark.

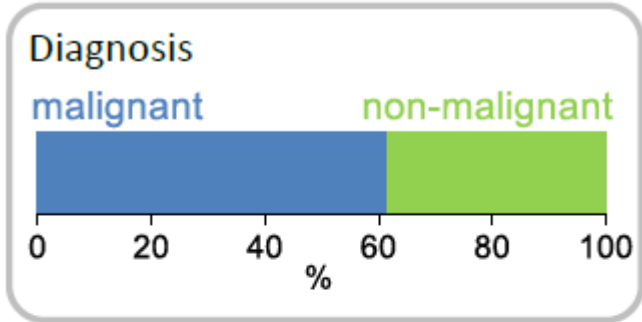
### Volume of data box



The volume of data box contains the total number of patients, episodes and phases for your service for the six-month reporting period. The graph shows the number of **episodes** and **phases** ending in the 6-month reporting period.

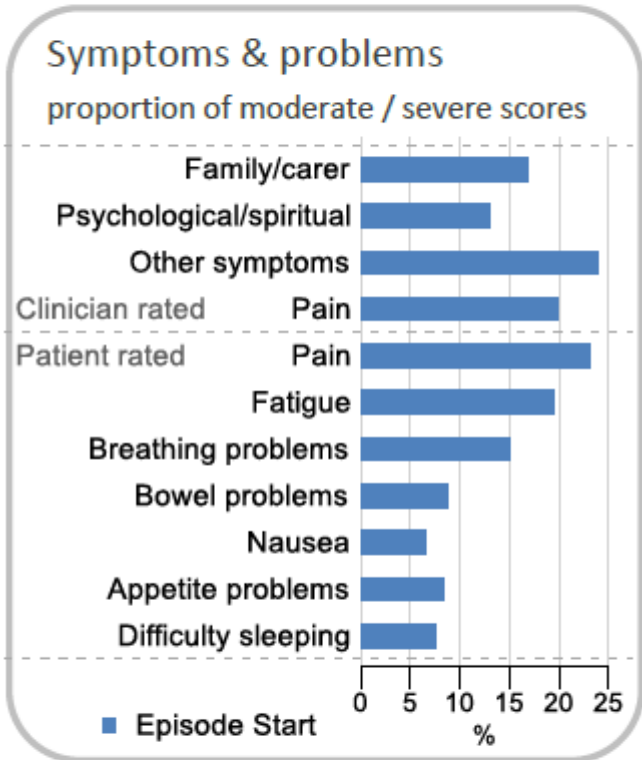

### Diagnosis, Symptoms & Problems and Phase boxes



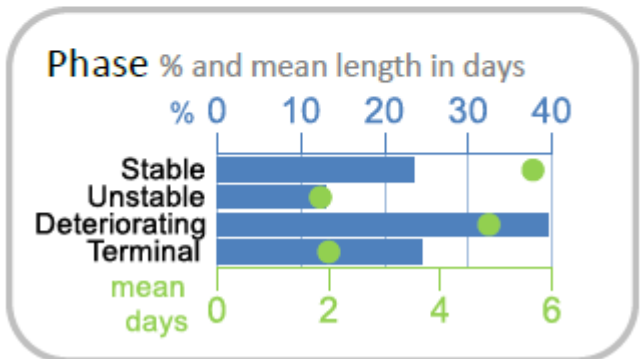
The diagnosis box contains the percentage of malignant and non-malignant patients cared for by your service. Diagnosis is captured once for each patient.

- **Blue** represents the percentage of patients with malignant disease.
- **Green** represents the percentage of patients with non-malignant disease.



The symptoms & problems box contains the proportion of combined moderate / severe scores that are recorded at the start of the PCOC episode (commencement of palliative care in one care setting).

*For example, ~24% of patients seen by the service experienced moderate or severe distress from Pain (SAS-patient reported) at the start of their PCOC episode.*



The phase box contains information about each of the four phase types at your service.

- The **blue bars** show the percentage of each phase type (as a proportion of all phases) and corresponds with the blue axis at the top of the graph.
- The **green dots** correspond to the mean (average) length of the phase in days and should be read with the green axis at the bottom of the graph.

### Age, Sex, episode end, Phases per episode and Episode length Boxes

#### Age at episode start

Mean: **75.0**

Median: **77.0**

The age box contains the mean (Average) and median age of the patients seen by your service at the start of their PCOC episode.

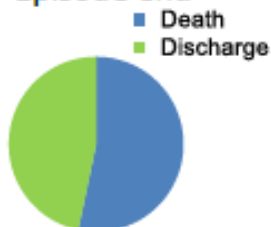
#### Sex



The sex box contains the percentage of male and female patients cared for by your service.

- **Blue** represents the percentage of male patients
- **Green** represents the percentage of female patients.

#### Episode end



The episode end box contains the percentage of episodes that have ended in death or discharge for your service.

- **Blue** represents the percentage of episodes that ended in death
- **Green** represents the percentage of episodes that ended in discharge. Discharge is separation from the care setting. It may or may not involve discharge from palliative care.

#### Phases per episode

**2.1**

The phases per episode box contains the average number of phases per episode for your service. This indicates the average number of changes in phase type. It includes all phase types.

#### Episode length

in days

Mean: **8.2**

Median: **4.0**

The episode length box contains the mean (average) and median episode length (in days) for your service. An episode of care is a period of care within one care setting. Please note the calculation of the mean service length excludes any episodes that were greater than 180 days.
