## WOOLYUNGAH INDIGENOUS CENTRE (WIC): ENHANCE YOUR EMPLOYABILITY SKILLS WITH WIC

You may be eligible to apply for the Student Representative position which advocates on behalf of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Students. A number of organisations offer structured Vacation/Internship programmes over the summer break. Apply for a Summer Vacation Program to enhance business skills, networking opportunities, training and feedback in a supported position. A range of these programs are available with corporate, government and NGO's, and are paid positions that run from December to January/February.
